Cornelia Burckhardt, as she prepared to turn the gavel over to the new President:


"The past two years have been very productive ones, in spite of the decrease in membership we maintained our quality of work and achieved remarkable success in all our endeavors"

I would like to recap some of the highlights of the past two years:

- The Thrift Shop added additional parking facilities to better serve their customers. The Volunteers successfully operated the Shop without a paid Manager for two months until one was hired in May.
- 2. The Snack Bar took on a new look with new wall covering and chairs. The new Manager made changes that were advantageous to the operation and attitude of the Shop
- The Gift Shop also took on a new look. The long awaited window was installed, and fresh flowers were added to the stock.
- 4. The Lobby was refurbished, wall covering new chairs and carpet were added.
- 5. The 1976 Fair was an overwhelming success Because of bad weather, the 1977 Fair did not have a chance to succeed, however, the chances and the Program proved to be our rain insurance.
- We had two beautiful Man O'War Balls that will take their place in our history of success.
- 7. \$62,507.07 in medical equipment was given to the Hospital. \$32,291.62 was spent on renovations, additions and furnishings. \$120,000.00 in pledges.
- New Policies and Procedures were adopted, slates and budgets accepted, Bylaws amended, history and membership preserved, publicity broadened, public relations extend-

ed, job descriptions compiled.
