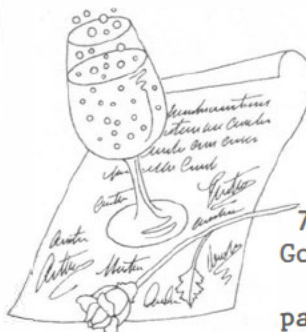

It was really a great idea, and wouldn't it have been a thrill to have the First Lady at our Fair!? Maybe next year, Ginger!

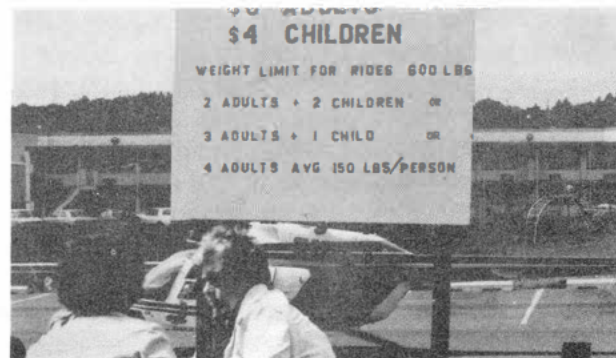
