



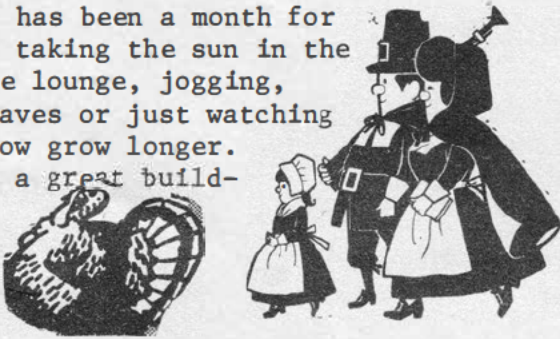

TEL-MED COMMUNITY PROGRAM BEGINS NOVEMBER 20TH

Initiating in California and mushrooming to the Last, a new health educational program has been gaining in interest and popularity.

This program - known as Tel-Med--has been sponsored in Philadelphia County by Pennsylvania Hospital and will now be brought to Delaware County by Riddle Memorial Hospital.

The program consists of a library of tapes on medically related subjects. These tapes, which are written for easy comprehension, cover a large variety of problems. For

example, are you concerned because you constantly tired and don't know why? Tape No. 42 may give you some insight on this problem. There are tapes on such subjects as hay fever, birth control, cancer, acne, weight control while quitting smoking--and even hiccups.

This information is as convenient as your telephone. In the privacy of your own home, and in complete anonymity, you may call the Tel-Med operator and request the tape that is of interest to you.

Tel-Med is in no way intended to replace your family physician, diagnose a specific ailment, or prescribe specific treatment. It is designed to ease your mind or direct you to the proper course of action.

The actual location of this installation will be on the ground floor of Granite Run Mall and is expected to be operational before the end of November.

It is believed that this service, the latest of Riddle's many community-oriented programs, will prove to be significantly beneficial to all Delaware County residents.

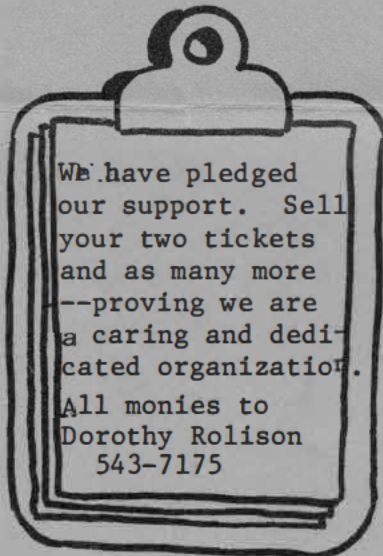
