FROM THE GENERAL BOARD

The Budget for 1981-82 has been passed, and it totals \$151,005.00. As of September, we have unallocated funds of \$288,722.25 which will enable us to pay off our Pledge quickly. While we have this money, it is paying close to 17% interest.

The Gift Shop has set up Workshops to make Christmas decorations to sell, and will have a Christmas Open House on November 10th. Please note the lovely plants Cornie has for sale.

Did you know that the Thrift Shop grossed \$5,000.00 on its opening day, and has been going great guns ever since? The Shop will be returning to having three paid workers for Saturdays for better efficiency. Auxilians will still be needed and appreciated; there are just some aspects of the Shop that respond better when handled by those who have regular experience in the Shop.

It was voted that on the death of an immediate family member, a \$25.00 Memorial contribution be sent to the Hospital from the General Fund: We are not taking any money away from the Hospital since it is used by Hospital anyway. It does help to alleviate the burden on our Sunshine Funds (can be used for "Get Well" only). We are asking that the Board be notified by Auxiliaries if a Memorial contribution is in order. It was also voted to make \$500.00 the amount to be given for all future Memorials to honor those who have given exceptional service to RMH. Such funds have been sent to honor Art O'Donald, Administrative Assistant, and Donald Mackie, Hospital Board Chairman.

A check for \$2,000.00 was turned over to the Board from the Volunteer Office, for which we sincerely thank them. Volunteer hours for the month of September, 1981-ADULTS, 4,912.50




THRIFT SHOP TOGETHERNESS
