SHORT PROCEDURE UNIT OPENS

In December, 1981, the doors to the new Short Procedure Unit opened.

This eight-bed Unit is located adjacent to the Operating Suite on the second floor of the Hospital. It was designed for patients whose physicians have determined their surgical procedures will not require an overnight stay in the Hospital.

With the advantage of Pre-Admission Testing, the time required as an In-Patient has been greatly reduced. Patients may now have the necessary tests taken three to seven days in advance of their surgery. On the day of surgery, the patient may go directly to the Short Procedure Unit.

Following the operation and Recovery Room observation, the patient is then discharged by the physician - all in the same day.

The benefits derived from the use of this Unit are:

- Patients return to a normal environment more quickly.
- Reduced hospitalization results in reduced hospital costs.


