The new \$2,5 million facility is adjacent to the Hospital and houses 23 suites, to be occupied by physicians on Staff at RMH. There will also be an Out-

Patient Pharmacy on the first floor and an Out-Patient Physical Therapy Treatment Center on the third floor.

Mr. Donald L. Laughlin, President of RMH, explained that the unique method of funding this was developed through the cooperation of the Delaware County Industrial Development Authority and the Riddle Memorial Center Associates.

Limited partnership in this undertaking were assumed by various Staff Physicians who will benefit from joint ownership of the building. After a period of forty years, ownership of the building will revert to Riddle Memorial Hospital.

Physicians have begun occupancy of the building and will be filled to capacity.

Additional parking is currently being added to provide adequate space for patient parking.
