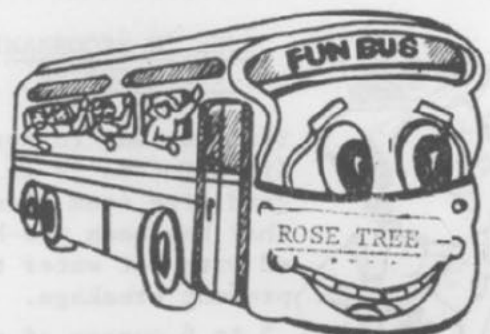

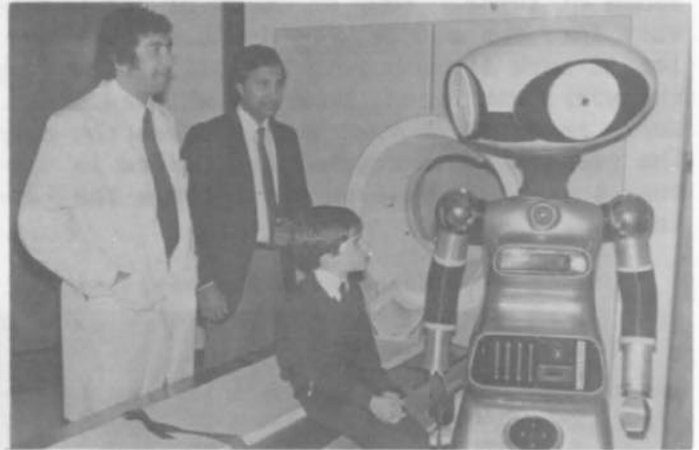

WELCOME NEW SIEMENS COMPUTERIZED AXIAL TOMOGRAPHY SCANNER (CT SCANNER)



Dr. Armand L. Bernabie, Jr., Director Of The Department of Radiology, Dr. Kamal B. Russell have the responsibility for operations for the new Scanner services. The first patient to be diagnosed on Riddle's CT Scanner was 8 year old Christian Goodman.

The EMI CT Scanner is a revolutionary advancement in the field of Radiology, since the discovery of the X-Ray.

The size, alone, is impressive. At 7:00 AM on Monday, September 19th, the crates containing the Scanner were carefully moved into the front entrance of the Hospital. The main unit was uncrated on the driveway, and then rolled through the Lobby, down the Laboratory, and on the way to the Radiology Department.

The Scanner helps provide physicians with a new "three-dimensional window" into such inaccessible areas of the body, brain, pancreas, liver, and lungs. Within mere seconds, the CT Scanner xrays cross sections of a particular area of the body and transfers the image onto a TV Computer Screen. Quick and painless, the CT Scanner became an important tool in the diagnosis of many illnesses.

Not only will this unit provide consistently high image quality and full spectrum of procedure as well as time.

Since I cannot meet with all of you individually, I find it difficult to know just what your thoughts are.

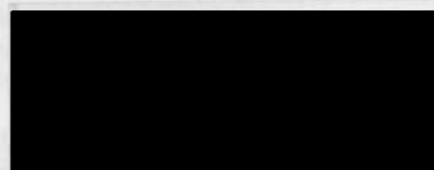
As President, I have tried, during my term, to represent you to the best of my ability. I am proud of what we have all accomplished. Without you, we never could have done it.
