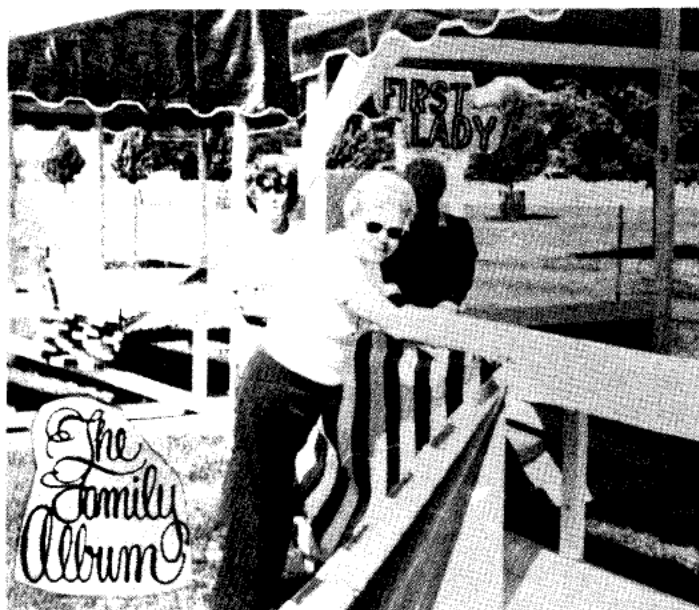

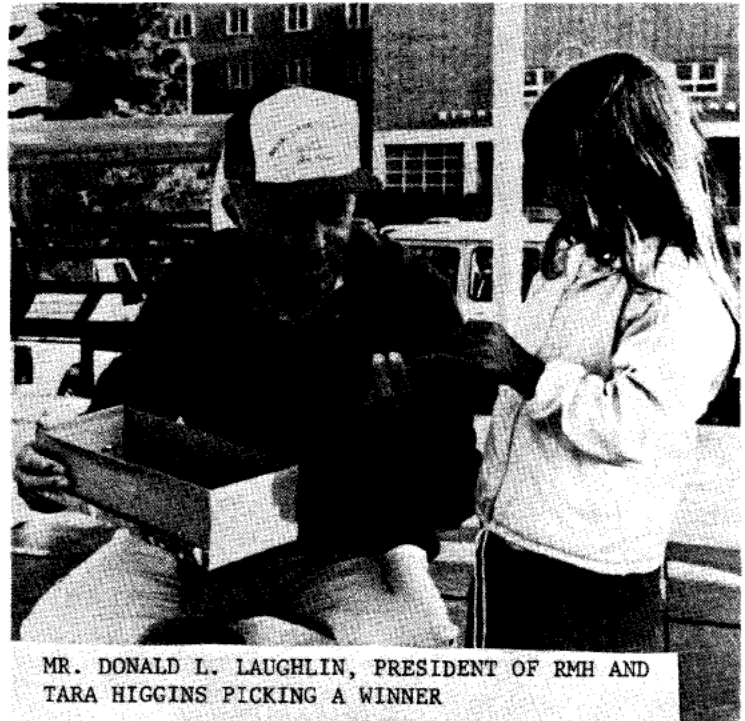

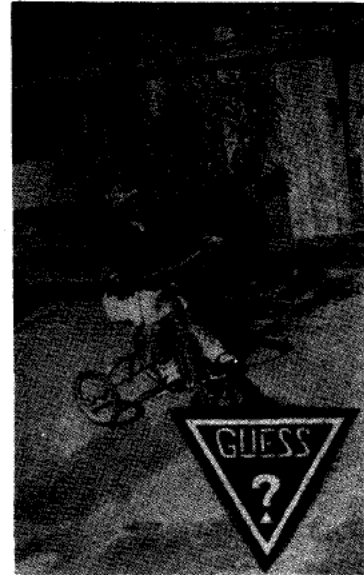
I wish it were possible to call each Auxilian and express my "thanks" for the help given to our Fair. But - "THANK YOU" I do!!!
