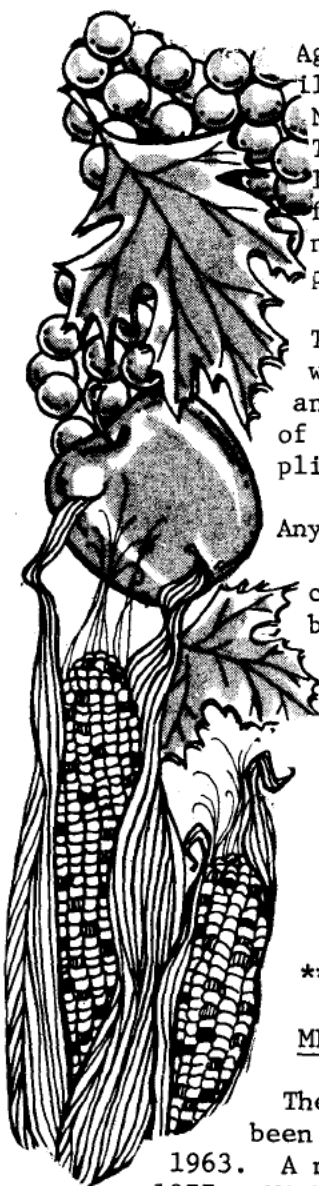

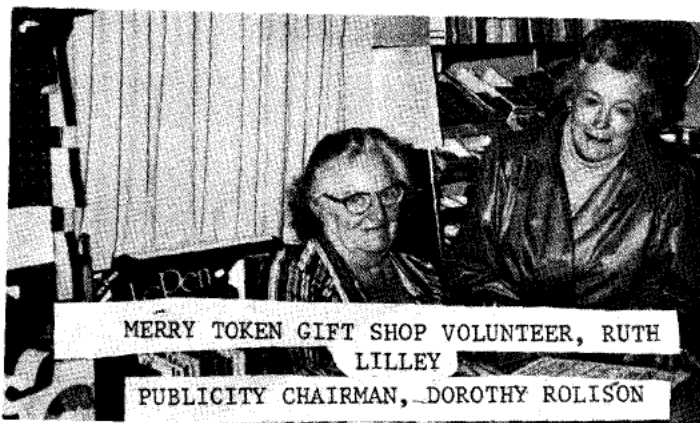

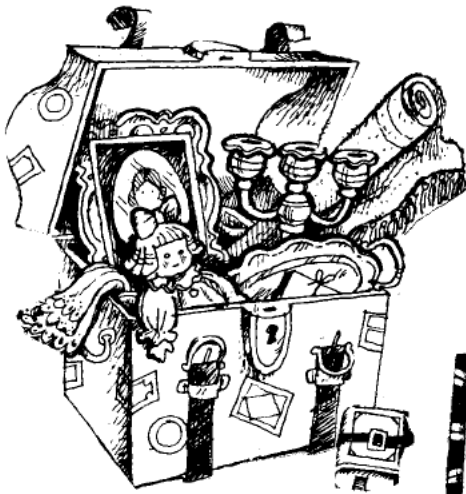

TEL-MED

The Tel-Med Community Program began November 20, 1978. The Program consists of a library of tapes on medically related subjects. These tapes, which are easily comprehended, cover a large variety of problems. For example, you are concerned because you are constantly tired and do not know why? Tape #42 may give you some insight on this problem. There are such tapes on subjects such as cancer, acne, common cold, weight control while smoking, and even hiccups!

This information is as convenient as your telephone. In the privacy of your own home, and in complete anonymity, you can call the Tel-Med Volunteer and request the tape that is of interest to you.

Tel-Med is in no way intended to replace your family physician, diagnose a specific ailment, or prescribe treatment. It is designed to inform you and direct you to the proper course of action.

The Tel-Med Booth is located in the Granite Run Mall - just outside of the Fidelity Bank.

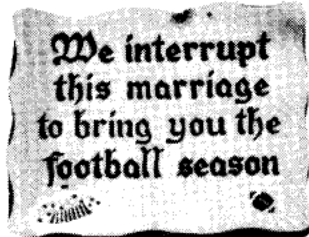

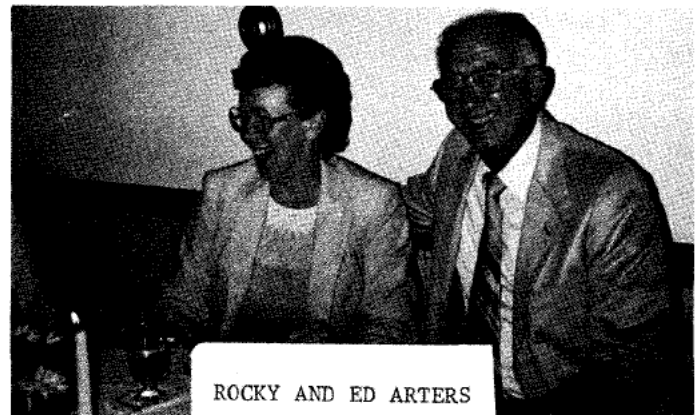
RIDDLE RAP (CONTINUED)

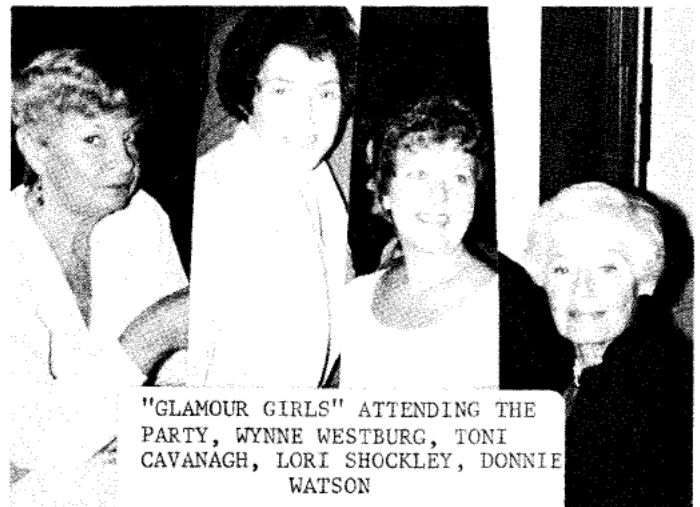

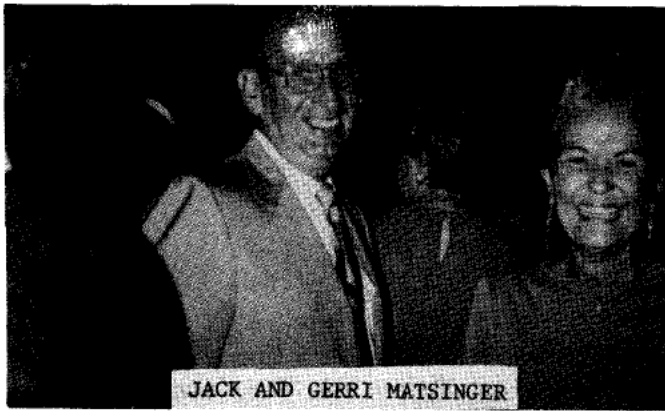

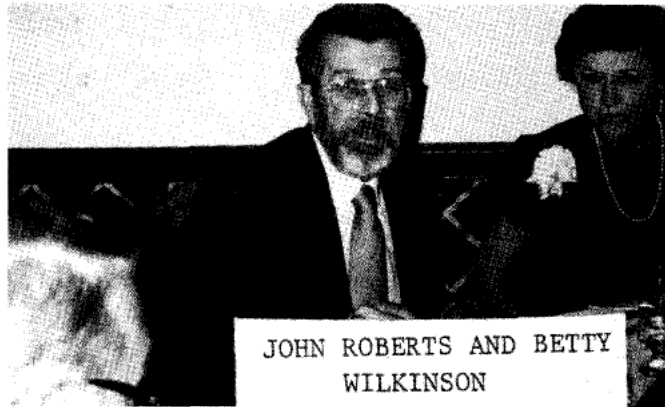
